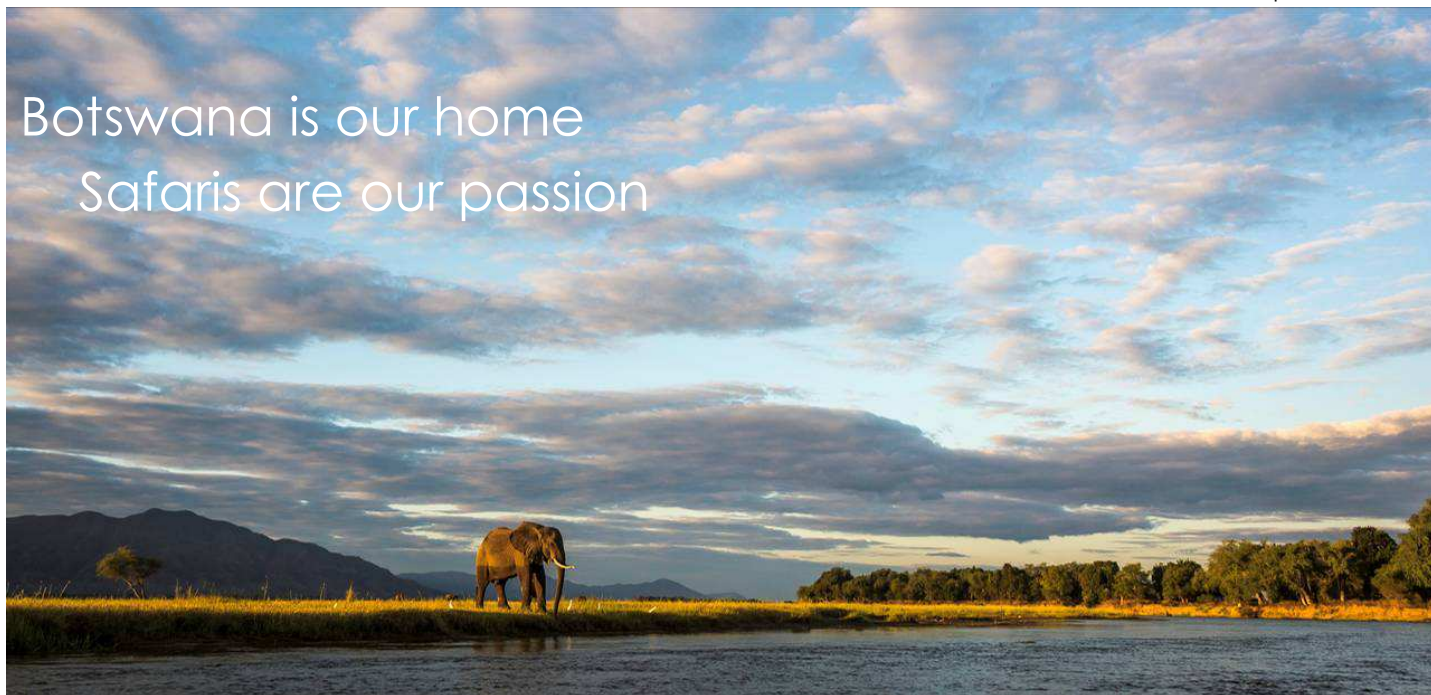

Detailed Itinerary:

Days 1 & 2: CHINZOMBO CAMP, South Luangwa National Park (fully inclusive)

Travel time: Lusaka – Mfuwe - Chinzombo
Scheduled flight followed by
approx 2 hours road transfer

On arrival at Lusaka Airport (possible pre-night may be required depending on connection times) you are met and assisted to your scheduled flight to Mfuwe Airport with Pro Flight (schedule varies with the season, morning flight recommended). On arrival at Mfuwe Airport, you are met and transferred by road to Chinzombo Camp, where you spend 2 nights on fully inclusive basis.

Chinzombo Camp, a Norman Carr Safaris camp, is situated just upstream of the original Kapani Lodge on the banks of the Luangwa River on a private land with Luangwa River footage with views across to South Luangwa National Park.



The luxury main area overlooking the river, has a fire pit, lounge/dining area, bar and swimming pool on a slightly raised deck.

Gigantic, ancient shade trees offer peace and tranquillity for guests staying in any one of the six stunning villas, one of which is a family suite with two bedrooms and two bathrooms, perfect for families or small groups. Each villa will have its own private pool, cooled sleeping areas, and spacious bathroom.

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The riverside location and peacefulness combined, make this camp one of the most game rich areas of the Valley and wildly luxurious. Activities include walking safaris and game drives.

AREA DESCRIPTION – SOUTH LUANGWA NATIONAL PARK

The Luangwa river is the most intact major river system in Africa and is the life blood of the parks 9 050 square kilometres. The park hosts a wide variety of wildlife, birds and vegetation. The now famous "walking safari" originated in this park and is still one of the finest ways to experience this pristine wilderness first hand. There are 60 different animal species and 400 different bird species. One special being Thornycroft Giraffe found only in the Luangwa Valley. Some magnificent trees grow in the Valley among the more common are the mopane, leadwood, winter thorn, baobab, large ebony forests, vegetable ivory palm, marula and the tamarind tree. The changing seasons add to the parks richness ranging from dry, bare bushveld in the winter to a lush green wonderland in the summer months. The dry season begins in April and intensifies through October, the hottest month when game concentrations are at its height. Warm sunny days and chilly nights typify the dry winter months May to August. The wet season begins in November as the leaves turn green and the dry terrain becomes a lush jungle. The rainy season last up until the end of March when the migrant birds arrive in there droves. The lodges in South Luangwa stay open as long as access is possible depending on their location. The lodges and camps in the valley all offer game drives and walking safaris.

Days 3 & 4: MCHENJA BUSH CAMP, South Luangwa National Park (fully inclusive)

Travel time: Chinzombo – Mchenja

After breakfast and possible morning activities (time permitting), you will be transferred by road to Mchenja Bush Camp, where you will spend the next two nights on a fully inclusive basis.

Mchenja, meaning "ebony", occupies a stunning setting beneath a magnificent grove of these trees on the banks of the Luangwa River. It is just a short morning's walk upstream from Kakuli Bush Camp and is in an area teeming with wildlife.



Although this camp takes luxury in the bush to a level not previously seen in Zambia, it is a bush camp designed to combine excellently with our other more rustic locations. The camp comprises five stylishly designed tents each under its own thatched roof and with a deck in front overlooking the Luangwa River. The tents have inside baths with an outside shower room. There is a small pool alongside the bar within the thatched main chitenje, allowing guests to seek cool refuge after their morning's safari activities.

As a luxury bush camp, Mchenja is the perfect destination to complete a walking safari that has combined stays at a number of our camps. Alternatively, those guests seeking a little more comfort and pampering may choose to combine a longer stay here, with a number of nights at the main lodge.

Guests staying at Mchenja can choose whether they want to view their wildlife on foot or from an open game-viewing vehicle. As is the case with Kakuli, the game viewing in this area is superb and night drives are usually very worthwhile. In addition to the ebony grove at camp there are two other stunning groves close by meaning that this most magnificent of trees plays a big part in your safari experience whilst at Mchenja.

Days 5 & 6: CHONGWE RIVER CAMP, Lower Zambezi National Park (fully inclusive)

**Travel time: Mchenja – Chongwe Camp
2.5 hours to Mfuwe Airport,
Scheduled flight via Lusaka to Royal Airstrip
and 20 minutes by road to camp**

After breakfast, and possible early morning activity (flight time permitting*) you are transferred by road to Mfuwe Airport for onwards scheduled flight to Royal airstrip (via Lusaka). Upon arrival at Royal Airstrip, you are met and transfer by road to Chongwe River Camp, where you will be staying for two nights on a fully inclusive basis.

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* In peak season the options are between an early morning connection through Mfuwe arriving just after midday, or a midday connection through Mfuwe landing late afternoon – please discuss options for Pro Flight flight times when arranging your safari.

Chongwe River Camp is situated on the confluence of the Chongwe and Zambezi Rivers, directly opposite Mana pools on the Chongwe River which is the boundary of the Lower Zambezi National Park, a 4000 km² sanctuary, considered as one of Africa's most picturesque wilderness areas.

Chongwe River Camp has a relaxed and yet vibrant atmosphere, the lounge scattered with bright cushions and tasteful artefacts and the tented rooms comfortable with touches of luxury. The camp is a luxury bush camp built into the natural setting, under a canopy of Albida thorn trees. Standard accommodation tents are Mulati design under thatch with en-suite reed bathrooms, each with River views and open gauze windows for optimal views of the Chongwe River. In addition there is the Albida 'honeymoon' suite and the Cassia suite which offer private lounge, dining and plunge pools as well as large spacious bedrooms with open yet private views to the confluence of the Chongwe and Zambezi Rivers.



One does not have to leave the camp to see and hear a wide variety of wildlife. The game viewing is exceptional, and varied with the choice of game drives in open safari vehicles, guided walking, canoeing or motor boating. Fishing is also a popular option. The canoeing from Chongwe generally meanders up the Chongwe River giving guests an opportunity to see herds of elephants at the river's edge as well as enjoy a huge variety of birdlife and other game. Chongwe is situated at the western boundary of the Lower Zambezi National Park and game drives are conducted into the park which hosts good populations of lion, leopard and wild dog.

Area description: LOWER ZAMBEZI

The park is still relatively undeveloped, but its beauty lies in its absolute wilderness state. The diversity of animals is not as wide as the other big parks, but the opportunities to get close to game wandering in and out of the Zambezi channels are spectacular. The park lies opposite the famous Mana Pools Reserve in Zimbabwe, so the whole area on both sides of the river is a massive wildlife sanctuary.

The river's edge is overhung with thick riverine fringe mostly diasporous, ficus and other riverine species. Further inland is a flood plain fringed with mopane forest and interspersed with winterthorn trees. The lower Zambezi National Park covers an area of 4092 square kilometres, but most of the game is concentrated along the valley floor. There is an escarpment along the northern end which acts as a physical barrier to most of the parks animal species. Enormous herds of Elephant, some up to 100 strong, are often seen at the river's edge. "Island hopping" buffalo and waterbuck are common. The park also hosts good populations of lion and leopard as well as cries of the fish eagle. The bird life along the river banks is exceptional. The best time is mid season from June to September, but most lodges and canoeing operators are open from April to November. Fishing is at its best in September/October.

Day 7 & 8: RUCKOMECHI CAMP, Mana Pools National Park (Fully Inclusive)

Travel time: Chongwe Camp – Ruckomechi Camp
Road/boat transfer

After breakfast, you will be transferred by boat, road and a final boat transfer across the border into Zimbabwe to Ruckomechi Camp where you spend 2 nights on a fully inclusive basis.

Situated on the western boundary of Mana Pools National Park, Ruckomechi Camp lies on the banks of the Zambezi, shaded by a large grove of acacia and mahogany trees and with a superb view of the mountains of Africa's Great Rift Valley across the river in Zambia.

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Ruckomenchi Camp accommodates guests in ten spacious en-suite tented units, including a honeymoon suite, all of which overlook the Zambezi River. Each tent has both indoor and outdoor showers, and the camp boasts a favourite amongst guests: its outdoor 'bath-with-a-view' in a secluded, scenic spot. The central dining, bar, library and lounge areas face the escarpment and are connected to the rest of the camp by walk-ways. There is a separate deck with infinity pool for swimming and sun bathing, and an inviting, cushion-strewn star gazing deck. The camp is as environmentally friendly as possible - hot water and lighting for each unit is provided by solar power.

The area is renowned for large numbers of elephant, buffalo, hippo and eland, especially in the winter when they concentrate along the river. Activities include wildlife viewing in open 4x4 vehicles, on motorised pontoon boats, on foot and in canoes.

Area description: MANA POOLS NATIONAL PARK

Mana Pools National Park is synonymous with the Zambezi River, elephants, lions, remoteness and wilderness. This unique park is a WORLD HERITAGE SITE, based on its wildness and beauty, together with the wide range of large mammals, over 350 bird species and aquatic wildlife. Mana Pools is one of Zimbabwe's most popular parks.

Mana Pools is the only game park in Zimbabwe to be granted World Heritage Status and encompasses some of Africa's largest areas of Acacia and Mahogany woodland, combined with spectacular, full-canopy Mopane forest. Mana Pools is part of a 300 million year old rift valley supporting a large variety of mammals and over 400 bird species. Mana Pools is 2,196 square kilometres in extent, runs along 80km of the Zambezi River, but is part of the 10,500 square kilometre Parks and Wildlife Estate that runs from the Kariba Dam in the west to the Mozambique border in the east. This large area is without physical boundaries and the wildlife is free to move throughout the area - even northwards across the Zambezi River into Zambia, where there are also large wilderness areas set aside for wildlife conservation. This national park has been set aside to be kept as wild as possible with only non-invasive, zero-impact tourism allowed. There are no safari lodges, generators, electric fences or other structures associated with safari camps as these are banned by law. All mobile camps must be taken down the day our clients depart to ensure minimal damage to the ecosystem.

The name "Mana" means "four" in the local Shona language. This applies to the four large pools inland from the Zambezi River. These pools are the remnant ox-bow lakes that the Zambezi River carved out thousands of years ago as it changed its course northwards. Hippopotamus, crocodiles and a wide variety of aquatic birds are associated with the pools. "Long Pool", is the largest of the four pools, extending some six kilometres in a west-east direction. This pool has a large population of hippo and crocodiles and is a favourite for the large herds of elephant that come out of the thickly vegetated areas in the south to drink.

As one moves northwards towards the Zambezi River from the forests on the Karoo sediments, the vegetation changes to open *Faidherbia albida* woodlands on the old river terraces. This vegetation gives a unique look to the area and a surreal light filters through the trees giving Mana Pools its distinctive cathedral-like atmosphere.

Lions, leopards, spotted hyena and cheetah are present in the area, but their secretive nature makes them more difficult to see. Despite this, it is not often that the visitor leaves Mana Pools without seeing at least one of these large carnivores. Northwards, off the river terraces, is the mighty Zambezi River flowing sedately on its way to the Indian Ocean. This now tranquil river was a major route for the trade in ivory and slaves in the dark past.

Days 9, 10 & 11: LITTLE MAKALOLO, Hwange National Park (fully inclusive)

Travel time: Ruckomechi – Little Makalolo approx 2 hour air transfer via Kariba

After breakfast, and possible morning activities (flight time permitting) you will be transferred by light aircraft from Mana West airstrip to Linkwasha airstrip. On arrival at the airstrip you will be met and transferred by safari vehicle to Little Makalolo, where you stay for three nights on a fully inclusive basis.

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Little Makalolo Camp is an intimate bush camp in the heart of Hwange National Park, offering a true bush experience yet with comfort and true Zimbabwean hospitality. Hwange is legendary for its wonderful array of wildlife and massive herds of elephant and Buffalo - especially in the drier winter months.



Accommodation consists of 6 walk-in tents with twin beds, one of which is a family tent with two adjoining sleeping rooms sharing a bathroom. Each room has an ensuite shower, toilet and basin - all with hot and cold running water and is fan cooled. There is also an outdoor shower for those who enjoy showering under the stars. The lighting in the rooms is battery powered thus ensuring peace and quiet in camp. Meals are enjoyed in the dining tent and there is also a separate tent housing the lounge and bar area. The camp has a plunge pool and close at hand is a 'log pile' hide overlooking the waterhole which allows guests to enjoy close-up game viewing.

There are excellent opportunities to view game: safaris are conducted in open 4x4 vehicles during the early morning and late afternoon when game is most active. Walking safaris are also offered and are accompanied by an armed professional guide.

Area description: HWANGE NATIONAL PARK

Named after a local Nhanzwa chief, Hwange National Park is the largest Park in Zimbabwe occupying roughly 14 650 square kilometres, as big as Northern Ireland. It is located in the northwest corner of the country about one hour south of the Mighty Victoria Falls. It became the royal hunting grounds to the Ndebele warrior-king Mzilikazi in the early 19th Century and was set aside as a National Park in 1929. Hwange boasts a tremendous selection of wildlife with over 100 species of mammals and nearly 400 bird species recorded. The elephants of Hwange are world famous and the Park's elephant population is one of the largest in the world. The park is home to over 35 000 elephants who in the dry season dominate all the water points in the afternoons. Other animals that can be seen in the park are lion, leopard, cheetah, rhino, buffalo, impala, kudu, sable, eland, waterbuck, zebra, giraffe, baboon and warthog.

Due to the vast size of the park the landscape varies from deep Kalahari sands in the south to rocky hilly country in the north. The open savanna woodland in the south east gives way to the thick teak woodland, which in turn becomes Mopane woodland. In so many habitats, there is an abundance of animals, birds and general flora. As the park is in a very arid region in terms of water, the water points are pumped from deep wells underground. At some of these water points there are very comfortable hides to sit in and watch the animals and birds. This makes the park a great place to visit at any time of the year depending on your main interests.

This area is also one of the last strong holds for the endangered Black Rhino. For those of you who are up to it, a morning of tracking the Rhino on foot is a must! Hwange National Park is one of the best parks to see and experience some great adventures.

Day 12: SAFARI ENDS HARARE AIRPORT

**Travel time: Little Makalolo – Harare Airport
approx 2 hour air transfer**

After the morning activity (departure time permitting) and breakfast, you will be transferred by road to Linkwasha airstrip, in time for your light aircraft to Harare Airport for their onwards travel arrangements.

Special Notes

Shared Transfers and Activities

Road, boat, air transfers and activities are quoted on a seat basis (on a shared basis and NOT private) unless otherwise requested or specified. Private charters/transfers can however be requested at an additional cost. Passengers may have various stops en-route to a destination adding to the duration of the transfer. International flight connections are accounted for in the daily schedules.

On shared transfers all the flight times are arranged a day before travel to avoid endless schedule changes. The transfer or charter company reserves the right to specify departure and arrival times.

Weight and Luggage restrictions

Please advise upon requesting a quotation where a traveller **weighs over 100kg**, as well as at time of confirming the booking, as it may be necessary to cost in an additional seat on internal flights for the passenger's safety and comfort.

Luggage is restricted on flight transfers to **20kg per person in soft bags**, which includes all hand luggage and camera equipment. Please refer to your itinerary notes, as in some instances, and in some countries, such as Zambia and Zimbabwe this limitation is decreased to 15kg per person. Please note that luggage in excess of the above restrictions shall result in additional costs for transport and/or storage and should be arranged in advance. Note that laundry can be done on a daily basis at most camps and lodges.

Health

Please confirm that all Clients are medically fit, in good physical and mental health and that there is nothing which renders him/her unfit to undertake the tour at the time of booking. - to ensure that the various services that constitutes the tour package will be carried out efficiently and as advertised;

Payment Terms
