## **Detailed Itinerary:**

Days 1 & 2: VICTORIA FALLS RIVER LODGE, Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe (full board with selected activities)

Travel time: Victoria Falls Airport – Victoria Falls River
Lodge
approx 30 minute road & boat transfer

On arrival at Victoria Falls Airport you are met by a local representative for private road transfer to Victoria Falls River Lodge, where you spend the following 2 nights on a full board basis with selected activities included.

Victoria Falls River Lodge is the first private game lodge to be set in the Zambezi National Park, the luxury tented lodge is situated on the banks of the mighty Zambezi River, just minutes from the Victoria Falls.







The spacious tents, standard, twin and family suites, are set right on the banks of the river. Each en suite tent has been decorated in earthy hues and offers a freestanding bath, sitting area, indoor and outdoor shower and a private viewing deck where one can sit and watch the exceptional wildlife. The main lodge has an open plan design where guests can sit back and relax, under the shade of the thatched roof, as elephants graze along the river line. The Victoria Falls River Lodge takes relaxation one step further offering a selection of in-room massages, pedicures and manicures, the lodge also has a swimming pool and gift shop with an exclusive selection of high quality arts and crafts from talented local artists.

Some of Africa's most amazing animals are right on our doorstep. Elephants, hippo, buffalo, giraffe, zebra, wildebeest, impala and even the occasional big cat can be viewed in the park. Victoria Falls River Lodge offer two daily safari options; the first is to take a river cruise along the Zambezi as you sip a sundowner or head out in a land cruiser to explore the 150,000 acres that make up the Zambezi National Park or take a night drive. For bird watchers, 415 bird species have been recorded in the park – it's a birders haven!

#### **AREA DESCRIPTION - VICTORIA FALLS**

Victoria Falls town lies on the southern bank of the Zambezi River at the eastern end of the Victoria Falls. It is a lovely tourist town which is easy to explore on foot and which offers a wide range of activities from the challenge of white water rafting and bungi jumping, to the awe-inspiring elephant back safaris and sunset cruises. It has something for everyone.

The Victoria Falls are one of the Seven Wonders of the World and is the largest sheet of falling water on earth-a spellbinding and mesmerising spectacle. The sheer mass of water cascading down the 100m drop across nearly 2km makes a thunderous roar and creates a magnificent spray of water that can be seen for miles - hence the local name 'Mosi Oa Tunya' meaning 'the smoke that thunders'.

Access to Victoria Falls is within easy walking distance from the town centre. Water flow over the falls varies throughout the year. The river's annual flood season is February to May when the spray can reach a height of over 400m, this is spectacular from above but it makes it very difficult to see the falls at ground level as it is under a heavy shower/mist. Water levels start dropping in August and are at their lowest October - December when much of the rocky face becomes dry. At times of low water, the falls are best viewed from the Zimbabwe side or from Livingstone Island.

Day 3 & 4: CHIEF'S CAMP, Mombo Concession, Moremi Game Reserve, Botswana

Travel time: Victoria Falls River lodge – Kasane Airport
Approx: 2 hour road transfer
Kasane Airport – Chiefs Camp
Approx: 80 minutes by air

After breakfast, road transfer back to Victoria Falls where you will meet up with a representative who will transfer you across the border to Kasane airport. Here you will meet with your porter and pilot and light aircraft transfer to Chiefs Island. Upon arrival at the airstrip, the guide will drive you to the camp which is a part transfer but also part game drive. You are booked here for 2 nights on a fully inclusive basis.

Please note that the flight is booked on a 'seat rate' basis and therefore flight times are not scheduled until

the day prior to flying, the lodge management will arrange your activities and transfers accordingly. Please note that there is a strict luggage restriction on all light aircraft flights of 15kg per person in soft bags, plus hand luggage.

Chief's Camp is located in the exclusive Mombo concession of the Moremi Game Reserve. The camp is situated on the north-western tip of Chief's Island, in what is termed seasonal Delta. This concession is revered as one of the region's prime game-viewing destinations and is known as the "predator capital" of Africa.







Guest accommodation at Chiefs Camp is comprised of twelve luxury tented rooms, each offering en-suite facilities and a private balcony. Comfort is ensured with five star amenities including ceiling fans, mini bars and hair dryers in each room. The main lodge complex houses the dining area, where world class cuisine is served with African 'flair'. There is an elegant bar, curio shop, library, and on the lower deck a large swimming pool with views across the floodplains where you will often see elephants at close range. In addition Chief's Camp features a luxury secluded spa with a full range of treatments, available for an additional charge.

Game viewing in the Mombo area of Chief's Island is nothing short of spectacular at any given time. Apart from its predators, the area is also renowned for its large concentrations of plains-game, elephant and buffalo. Game-drives are conducted in open 4x4 safari vehicles and mokoro excursions with guided walks are offered seasonally, water level dependant.

### AREA DESCRIPTION - MOREMI GAME RESERVE - CHIEF'S ISLAND

Moremi Game Reserve is a rich and diverse wildlife sanctuary within the Okavango Delta. The reserve is unfenced and its boundaries are defined naturally by river systems. The vegetation is varied, with dry land complemented by permanent and seasonal swamplands, resulting in an excellent diversity of both wildlife and birdlife.

Game is more concentrated around the permanent water during the dry season (Apr - Oct) with it becoming very hot in the later months. The heronries become active as the migrant birds return to Botswana from September through November, and general bird watching is excellent throughout the summer months. The rainy season (Nov - Apr) invigorates the lush scenery with wild flowers, dramatic thundershowers, spectacular sunsets and the birthing season brings great predator and prey interaction.

Chief's Island is the largest expanse of solid land in the Okavango Delta, approximately 1000 square kilometres, flanked by the Boro and Santantadibe Rivers. It was incorporated into Moremi Game Reserve in the 1970s, being the former hunting ground of Chief Mowana. Chief's Island incorporates the 'Mombo Concession' which is a game rich area to the north of the island with a good population of lion, leopard, buffalo, elephant, cheetah, wild dog and a huge variety of plains game as well as a small rhino population since the Rhino Rehabilitation Program. It is often referred to as the prime wildlife area in Botswana with only 3 camps having game drive access in the area. Please note that activities are restricted within the national park in accordance with government rules and regulations. These include no driving off-road, no walking and no driving after dark.

Day 5 & 6: BAINES CAMP, Southern Okavango Delta, Botswana (fully inclusive)

Travel time: Chiefs - Baines approx 20 min flight

After breakfast and a possible morning activity, (flight time permitting), light aircraft transfer to Baines Camp in the Okavango Delta, it is a flight of approximately 20 minutes followed by a short game drive through to camp where you spend 2 nights on a fully inclusive basis. Please note that the Elephant Interaction activity with Grey Matters is an optional extra.

Baines Camp, named after the famed nineteenth century explorer and artist Thomas Baines, is located on the Boro River, in a 260 000 acre private concession in the Okavango Delta that neighbours the Moremi Game Reserve.

Set amongst the shady trees and water of the delta, the small and intimate Baines' Camp features just five luxurious suites set on elevated platforms in the tree line. The elevated suites feature a spacious bedroom and elegant bathroom and are set on wooden decks that offer expansive views over the lagoon, which teems with life. At Baines Camp you have the unique opportunity to sleep under the stars on your fully mobile four poster bed.







The main area features an oversized deck for outdoor dining and offers views over the beautiful lagoon. There is a swimming pool with 2 thatched sala's on either side for your relaxation during the day.

The area is superb for viewing all animals and bird species. Guests may explore by land in open-sided 4 X 4 vehicles, often into the night, to discover nocturnal species as well as enjoying water safaris at the gentle pace of a poled mokoro or by safari motorboats (offered most of the year, subject to water levels). They can also undertake walking safaris on foot with skilled, armed professional guides. The choice of activities does not stop there, guests can also experience the unique and educational elephant interaction which is an optional activity and pre-booking is recommended.

### AREA DESCRIPTION - OKAVANGO DELTA

The Okavango Delta is one of the world's largest inland deltas situated in the middle of the largest stretch of continuous sand in the world - the Kalahari basin. This oasis in the middle of the desert is a rich yet fragile ecosystem, providing a life source for an incredible variety of wildlife. A wealth of species have adapted to the contrasting conditions created by living in the harsh Kalahari desert which is transformed annually with the arrival of the delta flood waters originating in Angola.

The Okavango wetland encompasses Moremi Game Reserve and surrounding regions divided into areas known as Private Concessions. These concessions are wildlife management areas, carefully administrated to balance the growing community's development and conservation, whilst empowering citizens through sustainable tourism. Many of the exclusive lodges in Botswana are situated within these concessions in the delta, providing an unparalleled wildlife experience - exclusive and remote, avoiding mass tourism and exploitation. Flood levels fluctuate dramatically throughout the year, with high water levels peaking in the central Okavango during the dry winter months and water levels at their lowest during the later summer months, contrary to the seasonal rainfall. The landscape, activities and game viewing vary considerably throughout the delta depending on your location, the season and flood levels. Some areas have larger tracts of permanent dry land which generally means there is more focus on land based activities (game drives) and big game viewing. Lodges situated on islands deep in the delta concentrate more on water activities such as mokoro excursions, walking, boating, fishing and bird watching. Those lodges situated on the outer fringes of the delta, referred to as the

'seasonal' delta, offer varied experiences at different times of the year - more water based during high flood levels and more land based as the flood recedes.

Game is more concentrated around the permanent water during the dry season (Apr - Oct) with it becoming very hot in the later months. The heronries become active as the migrant birds return to Botswana from September through November, and general bird watching is excellent throughout the summer months. The rainy season (Nov - Apr) invigorates the lush scenery with wild flowers, dramatic thundershowers, spectacular sunsets and the birthing season brings great predator and prey interaction.

Day 7: AFRICAN ROCK HOTEL, Johannesburg South Africa (dinner, bed and breakfast basis)

Baines – Maun – approx 20 min flight Maun – Johannesburg flight (not included) Johannesburg Airport – African Rock Hotel Approx: 10 min road transfer

After breakfast and a possible morning activity (flight times permitting), light aircraft flight transfer to Maun for your flight connection to Johannesburg. Please note the flight to Johannesburg is not included.

In the arrivals hall after clearing immigration you are met by a representative from African Rock Hotel holding a board with your name and it is a short road transfer to the guesthouse for your overnight stay on a dinner, bed and breakfast basis. Please note drinks and any extras are for your own account.

This boutique hotel is located 11 kilometres from the Johannesburg International Airport - O.R. Tambo, in the quiet suburb of Kempton Park away from the flight path of arriving and departing planes.







African Rock Hotel has 9 rooms that can accommodate 18 guests. A well established lush tropical garden, a swimming pool and large patio ensures relaxing outdoor living. The interior "look and feel" boosts a successful fusion of African, Western and Oriental design trends and offers a warm, welcoming and relaxing atmosphere. The Blue Hippo Restaurant at African Rock Hotel has a fusion cuisine, Western with an African touch & vice versa. It has quick and easy high way access to Johannesburg, the Sandton area as well as Pretoria. The hotel has a shuttle service to the airport and other destinations, city and country tours booking office and wellness and beauty treatments.

Day 8 – 12: AZURA QUILALEA, Qurimbas Archipelago, Mozambique (full board and selected activities) Travel Time: Pemba – Azura Quilalea resort Approx: 25 min helicopter ride

After breakfast you will road transfer back to Johannesburg for your flight to Mozambique (flight not included). Upon arrival at Pemba airport you will be met and transferred by helicopter to Azura Quilálea Resort where you are booked for 5 nights on a full board basis with selected drinks and selected additional inclusions: sunset cocktail, butler/host service, use of snorkelling equipment, kayaks, baobab walking trails. Further activities are for your own account.

Quilálea is an idyllic Mozambique island resort nestling in a forgotten corner of Mozambique's Quirimbas Archipelago in the tropical Indian Ocean. Completely uninhabited and surrounded by the sparkling, Azure waters of the warm Indian Ocean, Quilálea is the ideal honeymoon destination for those in search of the perfect romantic island getaway, or the ultimate holiday for those in need of relaxation, adventure and rediscovery.







The nine private villas are constructed from indigenous materials and handcrafted timber. Each villa offers magnificent sea views (either sunset or sunrise facing). The villas feature large windows with magnificent views, spacious bathrooms, air conditioning, ceiling fans and a luxurious king sized bed. The main lodge has an intimate bar, swimming pool and restaurant, though evening meals are usually taken on the beach, or in the privacy of your veranda. Food is first-class at Quilálea, including fresh seafood on the menu daily. Quilálea has a spa built into the rocks over the beach where you can enjoy the Karma Salaama massage while the sea laps gently underneath.

Days can be spent simply soaking up the sun by the swimming pool, on the pristine, white beaches or choose from a selection of optional activities on offer on the island. Diving, snorkelling, fly fishing, surf casting, sport

fishing, canoeing, island exploration, swimming, historical tours, dhow sailing trips and bird watching are all available on the island. The island has its own marine pavilion, which is a fully equipped fishing and PADI dive centre. Sport fishing and deep-sea angling are offered outside the sanctuary where game fish are plentiful. The warm sea lapping the island has been designated a marine sanctuary, the Quirimbas National Park. With fishing banned in this area fish have had a chance to breed and the coral has thrived.

Diving and snorkelling are excellent and both can be enjoyed by wading in from the beach. Expect to see turtles, eels, sand sharks, sea-cucumbers, and a multitude of colourful reef fish. Humpback whales pass through the islands on their annual migration and can be seen between July and November; dolphins can be observed year round.

Just 15 minutes by boat is the larger island of Sencar. Here you can kayak through the mangrove channels, with access to amazing birdlife and its primate inhabitants. Further afield - an hour or two away – is historic Ibo Island and a visit there is well worth the time and additional fee (not included).

Day 13: SAFARI ENDS PEMBA, Mozambique

Travel Time: Azure Quilalea resort – Pemba Approx 25 min helicopter flight

After breakfast transfer by helicopter back to Pemba airport you connect with your onward travel arrangements.

## **Special Notes**

### **Shared Transfers and Activities**

Road, boat, air transfers and activities are quoted on a seat basis (on a shared basis and NOT private) unless otherwise requested or specified. Private charters/transfers can however be requested at an additional cost. Passengers may have various stops en-route to a destination adding to the duration of the transfer. International flight connections are accounted for in the daily schedules.

In the event that a booking is not paid in full as per the above payment terms the Company reserves the right to refuse the Client(s) participation in the tour, and the client will be liable for any applicable cancellation fees.

## **CANCELLATIONS**

All cancellations should be made in writing and will only be deemed effective upon acknowledgment of receipt by the Company.

Cancellations will be subject to the following penalties:

- 20% of the total booking fee shall be payable immediately upon confirmation.
- 50% of the total booking 45 90 days prior to commencement of the tour.
- 100% of the total booking 44 days or less prior to the commencement of the tour.

Standard Cancellation fees shall apply in instances of postponed departure dates.

#### **RESERVATIONS**

Please be advised that for any quotes, no provisional bookings have been made unless otherwise specified by your consultant. Accommodation is subject to availability at the time of the booking.

Costs quoted are subject to change at any time due to *inter alia* excessive exchange fluctuations, fuel costs, taxes, levies, government regulations, rate of exchange, and factors that are imposed upon us by our suppliers and government that are beyond our control.

Provisional bookings will be held for a period of 12 days (unless otherwise advised), where after confirmation of the booking and payment of a 20% non-refundable deposit will be required to secure the booking, failing which the booking will be cancelled.
